- 1. Any written documentation evidencing "A 2010 Decision of Appointing Authority ordering that Trooper Scott Lopez be given 'verbal counseling' and associated letter," submitted by Defendant Under Seal will be released to Plaintiff as a public record.
- 2. That a Letter of Counseling dated August 21, 2018 to Trooper Scott Lopez submitted by Defendant Under Seal, will be released to Plaintiff as a public record.
- 3. That any of the remaining pages of LSP Trooper Scott Lopez, personnel file, submitted by Defendant Under Seal to the Court for In-camera examination, will be released to Plaintiff as a public record as may be ordered by the Court.

It is FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED, and DECREEDED that costs are assessed in favor of Robert Burns and against Col. Davis in his official capacity as Custodian of State Police Records pursuant to Article 1920, Louisiana Code of Civil Procedure.

The Court also FURTHER ORDERS that this judgment is STAYED pending review by the First Circuit Court of Appeals.
